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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At St George and St Martin’s we provide an engaging, strenuous, challenging and diverse physical education for all children.</li> <li>• We teach children life skills that will positively impact on their future and we believe that physical education is at the centre of that.</li> <li>• We strive to deliver a high quality physical curriculum that inspires all children to succeed and excel in competitive sport and other physically demanding activities.</li> <li>• We strive to provide opportunities for pupils to become physically confident in ways which supports their health and fitness.</li> <li>• We aim to develop pupil’s physical literacy whilst enhancing their enjoyment and knowledge of the subject, alongside teaching children how to cooperate and collaborate with others as part of a team, understand fairness and equality of play to embed life-long values.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pupils at St George and St Martin’s participate in twice-weekly high quality PE and sporting activities. We use a variety of teaching and learning styles in PE lessons, which we do through a mixture of whole class teaching and individual or group activities.</li> <li>• We celebrate the achievements our children make by drawing attention to good examples set by individual / groups of children, enabling a collaborative learning environment.</li> <li>• We encourage children to evaluate skills where appropriate, providing opportunities in lessons to do so, along with delivering opportunities for the children to collaborate and compete with each other.</li> <li>• Teachers provide differentiated, suitable learning opportunities for all children, matching the challenge of the task to the ability of the individual.</li> <li>• At St George and St Martin we provide opportunities for all children to engage in a variety of PE related extra-curricular activities. The school also competes in a variety of different competitions against other schools (both organised through the Newman Catholic Collegiate and through the City organisation).</li> <li>• We ensure that physical education lessons accommodate content from other areas of the curriculum where appropriate. PE provides numerous opportunities for pupils to apply literacy and numeracy whilst being active.</li> <li>• Each year group works towards the development and achievement of key objectives; these objectives have</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The impact of PE at St George and St Martin can be determined using teacher assessment-led data. On a termly basis each class provides assessment data collated during PE lessons in accordance with each year group’s key objectives.</li> <li>• Pupils will be assessed on their knowledge, use of technical vocabulary and development of skills. Class teachers will assess if pupils are working below expected, at the expected level or at greater depth against the PE National Curriculum objectives.</li> <li>• Assessment data will also be recorded from the children’s swimming lessons. This will document their progress and indicate which swimming level they have achieved.</li> <li>• Additionally, impact will be measured through the use of fitness tests at different points in the year. The use of the ‘bleep test’ provides a clear numeric indication of each child’s fitness level, and by conducting this test at different points in the year, progress (and thus impact) is clear to see.</li> </ul> |
